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1.0 Call to Order

The special meeting of the Geauga County Board of Health was called to order at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 12, 2023, by President Carolyn Brakey. The meeting was held at the Geauga County Office Building located at 12611 Ravenwood Drive, Chardon, Ohio.

<u>Permission to Adopt Change to Home Sewage Treatment Rules, Third and Final Reading</u>

Dr. Mark Rood moved and Dr. Mark Hendrickson seconded a motion to adopt the third reading of the regulation change to Section 3701-29-19e, the Ohio Home Sewage Treatment System Rules, Geauga County Supplemental Rules to state that the Geauga County Board of Health adopts a rule requiring the collection of the required NPDES samples to be completed by the Geauga County Board of Health. This item was tabled at the March 22, 2023, meeting until

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a regulation adoption process has been added to the by-laws. Motion carried with a roll call vote. Ms. Brakey, yes; Dr. Rood, yes; Ms. Roman, yes; and Dr. Hendrickson, yes.

Current Language:

The Geauga County Board of Health adopts a rule authorizing service providers registered with the Geauga County Health District to collect samples for NPDES annual sampling requirements.

Proposed Change to Section:

The Geauga County Board of Health adopts a rule requiring the collection of the annual required NPDES annually required sample to be completed by Geauga County Board of Health.

This is needed to change the supplemental rule that Geauga County had previously set to allow service providers to take National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) samples. Currently, that is not being done. Only 8% of the approximately 1,600 systems were sampled last year and less than 25% of them met the criteria for water quality standards. If the systems do not work properly, they can allow direct discharge of sewage into the county waterways. By changing this regulation section, we would like to collect those samples ourselves, cost efficiently and to make sure homeowners are in compliance with the law.

Discussion:

Adam Litke noted that the reading at the June 28, 2023, regular meeting was only the second one due to a previous postponement.

Resolution 2023-11 - Geauga Public Health Levy

Dr. Mark Hendrickson moved and Dr. Mark Rood seconded a motion to adopt Resolution 2023-11. Motion carried with a roll call vote. Ms. Brakey, yes; Dr. Rood, yes; Ms. Roman, yes; and Dr. Hendrickson, yes.

Discussion:

Adam Litke shared the levy process: If approved, it will go to the County Commissioners, then to the County Auditor to certify, back to the County Commissioners, and then to the Board of Elections.

Dr. Mark Rood said the levy is to sustain the programs we have through this budget cycle. This is the most taxpayer-friendly way of accomplishing that task while still meeting the minimum commitments of the Board of Health.

Lynn Roman said there would also be an increase in dollars as a result of new construction. Carolyn Brakey discussed the three sources of funding to the health district: fees and licenses, but funds are limited in their uses; grants, which are limited due to the county being healthy,

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wealthy, and small in population; and the levy. As long as we continue with the renewal, the county residents benefit from the Homestead Rollback, in which the state pays $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ of it. Lynn Roman said the renewal is a low amount, about \$5.41 per \$100,000, for its value. Carolyn Brakey said she believes that the Board has done everything it can to responsibly manage the health department's finances.

Dr. Mark Hendrickson asked how much funding is received from grants and fees. Adam Litke said it varies, but fees are a vast majority of it, but it's also a vast majority of funding for the Environmental Health staff. Grants are usually about \$200,000 or less depending on which ones are awarded; not all grants are guaranteed and the county is too small for some grant eligibility. Dr. Mark Rood said that having this levy during an election with a number of other items on the ballot will help lower the cost of putting this levy on the ballot.

<u>Permission to Award the Parkman Township Well Replacement Project Phase II Bid to the Lowest and Best Bidder</u>

Lynn Roman moved and Dr. Mark Hendrickson seconded a motion to award the Parkman Township Well Replacement Project Phase II Bid to the lowest and best bidder, not to exceed \$600,000. Motion carried with a roll call vote. Ms. Brakey, yes; Dr. Rood, yes; Ms. Roman, yes; and Dr. Hendrickson, yes.

Discussion:

Adam Litke said that the lowest bidder did not submit all forms. The prosecutor's office said that bid cannot be accepted since the health department would incur a huge liability as it did not meet the criteria. Bidders were reminded to turn in all paperwork at the bidders meeting. Adam Litke said Donamarc was the lowest bidder with the complete bid packet. Donamarc was also awarded Phase I of the project and has worked with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on other contracts.

<u>Permission to Grant Geauga Public Health Authority to Contract with a Landscaping Company to Complete Landscaping for Parkman Wells Phase I Work</u>

Dr. Mark Hendrickson moved and Lynn Roman seconded a motion to grant Geauga Public Health authority to contract with a landscaping company to complete landscaping for Parkman Wells Phase I Work to the lowest and best bidder, not to exceed \$15,000. Motion carried with a roll call vote. Ms. Brakey, yes; Dr. Rood, yes; Ms. Roman, yes; and Dr. Hendrickson, yes.

Discussion:

Adam Litke said the first contractor did not respond to the necessary county vendor form until recently. There are now two companies that are interested and the contract will be awarded this evening. This will be paid with monies from the Phase I funds.

Permission to Approve Appropriations for Increase/Decrease

Dr. Mark Rood moved and Lynn Roman seconded a motion to approve Appropriations for Increase/Decrease as presented. Motion carried with a roll call vote. Ms. Brakey, yes; Dr. Rood, yes; Ms. Roman, yes; and Dr. Hendrickson, yes.

Discussion:

Adam Litke said that when the increase in appropriations was approved at the June 28, 2023, regular Board meeting, it was to be taken out of the general fund. After discussion, it was decided that the better option is to appropriate the money in the Sewage Treatment Fund, transfer additional money from the general fund to it in order to meet the requirement, and use the money from that fund. The \$1,100,000 from the appropriations approved at the June 28 meeting will need to be rescinded at the next Board meeting.

Citizens' Remarks

Carolyn Brakey outlined the process and policies for providing public comment. Those who would like to comment but not attend the meeting are invited to email info@geaugacountyhealth.org and their comments will be forwarded to the Board.

A citizen asked questions about his home's status in relation to the Parkman Wells Project. Adam Litke said they will work with homeowner to answer his questions after the meeting. The citizen also asked about the sewage taxes. Carolyn Brakey said she believes he is referring to the reappraisals of homes where the wells have been impacted, but he will need to contact the auditor's office for more information.

A citizen asked if the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) or the state is helping with the wells, money-wise. Adam Litke stated that the Ohio EPA has contracted with Geauga Public Health to replace the wells. The first contract, "Phase I", was for \$300,000. The second part, "Phase II", was for \$600,000. ODOT did move their facility.

BOARD OF HEALTH GEAUGA COUNTY HEALTH DISTRICT RESOLUTION NO: 2023-11

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GEAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO AUTHORIZE A TAX IN EXCESS OF TEN MILLS

The Geauga County Board of Health ("Board of Health") met in special session on July 12, 2023 at 12611 Ravenwood Drive, Commissioner's Chambers, in Claridon Township, Ohio with the following board members present:

Board Member Mana Campion of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Townships and Villages of Geauga County are organized into a General Health District and the Board of Health is organized pursuant to Ohio Revised Code § 3709.03 as a General Health District Board of Health with the duties and authority as set forth in Chapters 3707 and 3709 of the Ohio Revised Code;

WHEREAS, the Board of Health is collecting monies from an existing 0.2 mill levy for the purpose of providing sufficient funds to the Board of Health to carry out its health program, and said levy is due to expire at the end of tax year 2023, with collection in tax year 2024; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code § 3709.29 the Board of Health certifies to the Geauga County Board of Commissioners that it is estimated that the amount of money necessary to meet the expenses of the Health District's program will not be forthcoming to the Board of Health out of the Health District's fund because the taxes within the ten-mil limitation will be insufficient;

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Health hereby certifies to the Geauga County Board of Commissioners that it is estimated that the amount of money necessary to meet the expenses of the Health District's program will not be forthcoming to the Board of Health out of the Health District's fund because the taxes within the ten-mil limitation will be insufficient;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Health requests the Geauga County Board of Commissioners, as the taxing authority for the Board of Health, to declare by resolution that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the requirements of the Health District within Geauga County, and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation for the renewal of the existing 0.2 mill levy first voted in 2009, for a period of 5 years in order to provide the Board of Health with sufficient funds to carry out such health program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Health requests the Geauga County Board of Commissioners to pass such resolutions in order to submit such question to the ballot for the general election to be held November 7, 2023.
